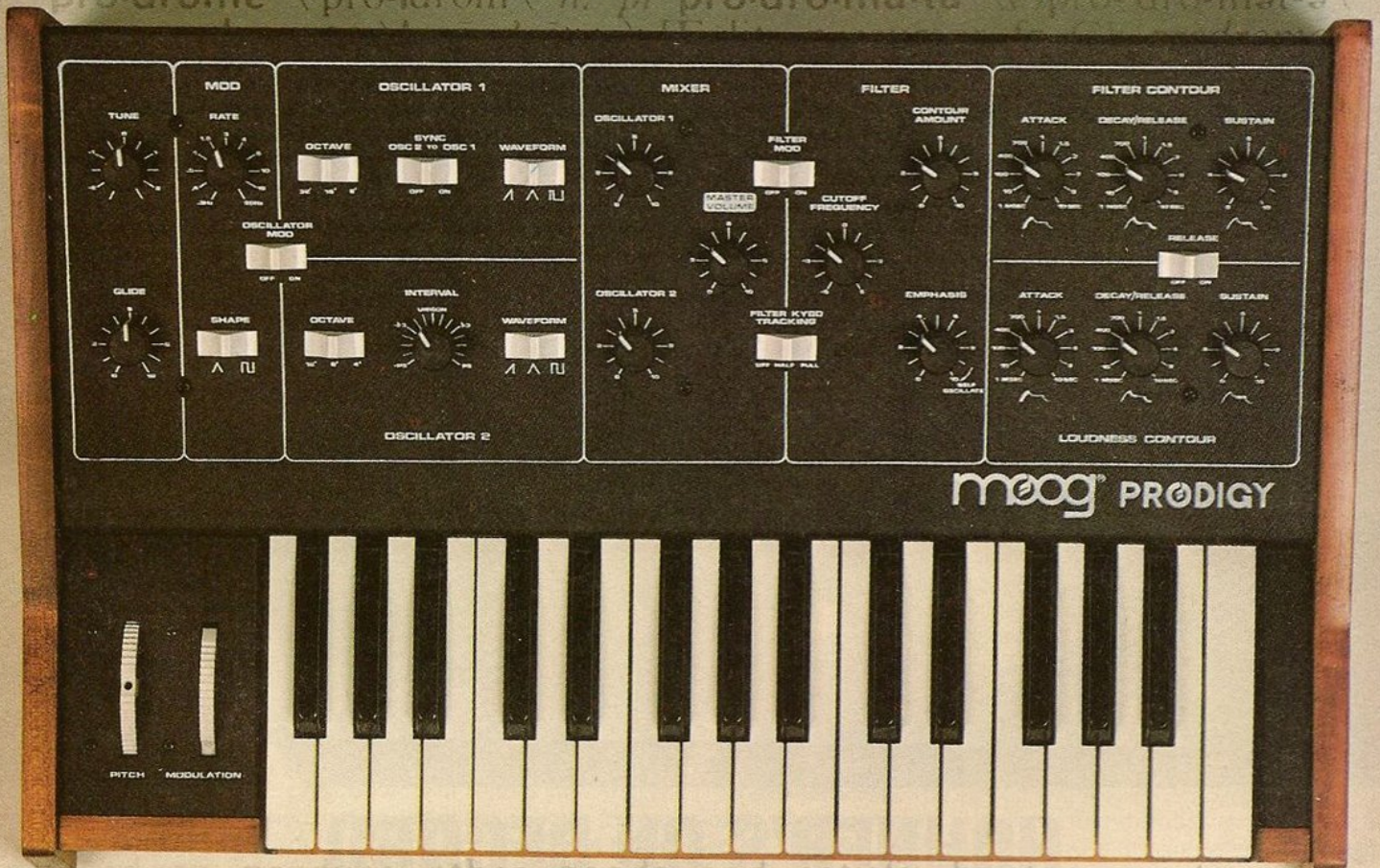

**pro-dro-mal** \ (')prō-'drō-məl\ or **pro-drom-ic** \-'drām-ik\ *adj* : PRECURSORY, *esp* : marked by prodromes

**pro-drome** \ 'pro-'drom\ *n.*, *pl* pro-dro-ma-ta \ (')pro-'dro-mat-ə\
